

The Incorporation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Agenda among Asia-Pacific Higher Education Institutions: a Case Study of the University Mobility of Asia Pacific (UMAP) Consortium

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The study focuses on understanding the current practices and approaches to the SDGs among the UMAP members. Advancing the SDG agenda as a consortium requires a more cohesive and collective set of strategies. The findings from this study are to frame the UMAP SDG taskforce strategy. Currently, UMAP has over 500 member universities from 20 countries. The study was conducted using a survey of 171 university members and an interview session with ten representatives from UMAP member countries dealing with the SDGs. Key findings stated that the institutions recognise the importance of addressing the SDGs and are working on streamlining their plans to achieve these goals. UMAP can facilitate collaboration, workshops, and projects among universities to meet the SDGs.
